## Playing a vital role in the state economy

During the fiscal year ending June 30,2004 , the Delaware Lottery contributed $\$ 222$ million to the state's General Fund, maintaining its position as the fourth largest source of revenue for the state. Since 1975, the Lottery has:

- Generated nearly $\$ 5.5$ billion in revenue
- Paid out more than $\$ 1,013$ million in cash and other prizes to winners of traditional lottery games
- Contributed more than $\$ 1.8$ billion to the State of Delaware


## Funding essential state services

By law, the Delaware Lottery exists to generate income to fund essential state services. The Lottery accomplishes this by contributing nearly one-third of its sales revenue to the State General Fund, the pool of dollars that supports the majority of state services. Established by the State Legislature in 1975 as a means of generating revenue, the Delaware Lottery operates under the aegis of the State Department of Finance. The Legislature allocates the General Fund, with the governor's approval, in support of state services including education, health and social services; public safety; judicial and corrections; and various child, youth and family services. In addition to the Lottery, other sources of
income for the General Fund are state taxes, franchise taxes, gross receipts taxes, public utilities taxes, and cigarette taxes. Without the Lottery's contribution to the General Fund, more taxes would be required to fund the state services upon which we all rely. Therefore, Lottery revenue benefits everyone who lives in, works in, or visits Delaware.

## Promoting responsible play

The Lottery recognizes the need to balance its legal responsibilities with its legislative mandate. This is achieved by its consistent use of "Play Responsibly" messages, in addition to the tollfree Delaware Gambling Helpline telephone number, in advertising and other communications materials. These messages direct people seeking help for problems with gambling to the appropriate resources. The Lottery contributed nearly $\$ 1.5$ million in fiscal year 2004 to help fund gambling-related programs offered by the Department of Health and Social Services. Furthermore, the Lottery supports laws that restrict use and marketing of its products to players 18 years of age or older. Through its ongoing public relations programs, the Lottery regularly encourages players (especially when jackpots are high) to play responsibly and to avoid spending more than they can afford on tickets.

## SuPPorting Small business

The Lottery supports the small business community in Delaware, from which its network of licensed Lottery retailers is primarily drawn. This network consists of nearly 500 retailers throughout the state who are responsible for daily contact with players and the sale of Lottery tickets. Local economies benefit from the partnership between the Lottery and the network via sales incentives offered to retailers and commission bonuses awarded to those retailers who sell winning tickets. The Lottery also supports its retailer network via a comprehensive signage program, as well as other in-store merchandising and training materials. During fiscal 2004, the Delaware Lottery developed a new in-store system to help improve retail sales of Instant Game tickets at all price points, a comprehensive signage program to support online games and Delaware Lottery winners, and training and support on an ongoing basis.

## Rejuvenating horse racing

Video Lottery provides a source of business and revenue needed to support legislative efforts to rejuvenate the state's horse racing industry. Under the supervision of the Delaware Lottery, Video Lottery is operated at the three racetracks in the state. Delaware Park and Dover Downs have been operating Video Lottery since December, 1995, and Harrington Raceway began Video Lottery operations in August, 1996. At the end of fiscal year 2003, legislation passed to enable continued expansion at all three tracks. As a result of new contractual agreements in fiscal 2003, gaming vendors initiated programs to replace and upgrade many of their existing Video Lottery terminals. These replacements and upgrades were completed in fiscal year 2004 and continue to help Delaware's Video Lottery maintain its position as one of the most successful in the United States on a net-proceeds-per-machine basis. Delaware's Video Lottery has paid more than $\$ 40$ million in cash and other prizes since its inception in 1995.
