## From the Director, Wayne Lemons

Fiscal year 2009 offered the Delaware Lottery an opportunity to harness change and help the State begin to address economic and budgetary obstacles emerging in a difficult economic climate. The Lottery continued to deliver on its role as a top revenue generator for the State while preparing for upcoming initiatives that would impact the future of gaming in Delaware. The 12-month period also saw the Lottery reinforce its role in developing relationships with community businesses, both small and large, from independent retail operators to the largest entertainment destinations in the state.

Both the Lottery's Traditional and Video Lottery Games generated a steady stream of revenue, contributing $\$ 248$ million to the State this fiscal year. Traditional Lottery games continued to entertain players,
 engaged new audiences and drew thousands of consumers to outlets that offer Delaware Lottery Games. The Lottery also developed stronger relationships with community businesses throughout the year. More than 500 Licensed Retailers served the First State as the front line of player communication and interaction. In the meantime, Video Lottery games were rotated regularly to keep products fresh and consumers entertained. Video operators collectively offer more than 8,000 video terminals at Delaware Park, Dover Downs and Harrington Raceway.

These stakeholders are one of the most important components of our operations and perform a critical function in helping the Lottery fulfill its mission to generate revenues to benefit all State residents. We strive to make these relationships mutually beneficial by offering attractive products to a variety of operators so their businesses become more profitable and more appealing to consumers.

While this fiscal year was one of the most financially challenging in the State's history, the Lottery successfully contributed a sizable amount to the General Fund, decreased the burden on taxpayers, and generated additional revenue for many hundreds of businesses statewide. The Lottery is proud of its contributions and its ability to maintain integrity in preparation for change and newfound opportunities.

## 2009 At A Glance

During the fiscal year ending June 30, 2009, the Delaware Lottery contributed $\$ 248$ million to the State's General Fund, maintaining its position as the fourth largest source of revenue for the state.

Since 1975, the Lottery has...

- Generated more than $\$ 9.16$ billion in revenue
-Paid out more than $\$ 1.3$ billion in cash and other prizes to winners of traditional lottery games
- Contributed more than \$3.07 billion to the State of Delaware


## General Fund: Giving Back To The State

The Lottery exists, by law, to generate income to fund essential State services. The Lottery accomplishes this by contributing all profits from ticket game sales and Video Lottery operations to the State's General Fund, the pool of dollars that supports the majority of State services.

Established by the State Legislature in 1975 as a means of generating revenue, the Delaware Lottery operates under the State Department of Finance. With the governor's approval, the Legislature is responsible for allocating the General Fund. State services that benefit from the General Fund include Delaware's public education system; the departments of health
and social services; public safety; judicial and corrections; and various children, youth and family organizations.

In addition to the Lottery, other sources of income for the General Fund are State taxes, franchise taxes, gross receipt taxes, public utilities taxes and cigarette taxes. Without the Lottery's contribution to the General Fund, additional tax dollars would be needed to fund State services. Therefore, the Lottery benefits everyone who lives in, works in or visits Delaware.

## General Fund: Giving Back To The State

## Products

The Lottery supports its mission to maximize revenue contributions to the State's General Fund through marketing, sale and distribution of innovative, entertaining and secure Lottery products through its network of licensed retailers. These products include popular games such as POWERBALL®, HOT LOTTO®, FAST PLAY®, Multi-Win LOTTO, PLAY 3, PLAY 4 and a variety of Instant Games. The network consists of nearly 600 retailers throughout the State who are responsible for daily contact with players and the sale of Lottery tickets.

## Accessibility

The Lottery continues to identify and license new retail outlets to fulfill its obligation to ensure its products are accessible to all adult citizens, including persons with disabilities. The Lottery will continue to require that its existing retailers provide access to Lottery products in their stores for all customers in accordance with Lottery rules and regulations and guidelines required by the Americans with Disabilities Act.

## Incentives

The economic wealth of local communities benefits from the Lottery's relationship with local businesses licensed to sell Lottery tickets. Retailers receive sales incentives and bonuses for the sale of Lottery tickets. Lottery tickets help to drive traffic in to stores and diversify overall product offerings for merchants. Lottery products are sold in stores in a variety of trade styles, from mom-and-pop shops to corporate chains. It all adds up to healthy business communities in New Castle, Kent and Sussex counties.

## Video Lottery: Paving The Way

Video Lottery provides a source of business and revenue needed to support legislative efforts to rejuvenate the state's horse racing industry. Under the supervision of the Delaware Lottery, Video Lottery is operated at the three racetracks in the State. Delaware Park and Dover Downs have been operating Video Lottery since December of 1995 and Harrington Raceway began Video Lottery operations in August of 1996.

As of June 30, 2009, the racetracks collectively offered 8,046 Video Lottery terminals, with 2,966 machines at Delaware Park, 3,029 at Dover Downs and 2,051 at Harrington Raceway. Delaware's Video Lottery continues to be one of the most successful in the United States on a net-proceeds-per-machine basis.

## Promoting Responsible Play

The Lottery follows State of Delaware ethics guidelines and self-imposed standards in all its advertising, marketing and communications activities to ensure fulfillment of its responsibility to the public.

As a component of its civic responsibility, the Lottery helps fund programs offered by the State's Department of Health and Social Services for problem gamblers. The Lottery contributed more than $\$ 1.7$ million in fiscal year 2009 to help fund gambling-related programs offered by the Department of Health and Social Services through the Delaware Gambling Helpline.

The Lottery further supports responsible play with messages in advertising, at point-of-purchase and in other communications: "Play Responsibly" and "It's the Law: You must be 18 years of age or older to purchase Delaware Lottery tickets." When jackpots are high, public statements are issued to include gambling assistance numbers and to remind players not to spend more than they can afford for Lottery tickets.

Responsibility is extended through age restrictions and the security surrounding winning tickets. The Lottery and its licensed retailer network support laws to restrict use and marketing of its products to players 18 years of age and older. In-store Quick Check features allow players to check their own tickets, and signs at point of sale remind players to sign their tickets.

The Lottery's Web site is designed to comply with the accessibility guidelines developed through the WAI (Web Accessibility Initiative) and the Web Presentation Guidelines for State of Delaware Agencies.

Finally, the Delaware Lottery helps players protect themselves through a Delaware Law that allows them to maintain their anonymity and withhold their name and likeness from being used for promotional purposes. After all, winner privacy is our policy.
